



PHOTOGRAPHY/SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

PURPOSE

At Trinity Netball Club (TNC), we believe that everyone who participates in any aspect of the club is entitled to do so in an enjoyable and safe environment. We ensure the committee and members of TNC carry out appropriate procedures when using social media, photographs and video footage in relation to the club. Photographs will only be taken by someone that holds a current Working With Children Check.

Social Media (e.g., Facebook), email and the website is essential for sharing club news and information with our members. Our communication will be timely, appropriate and related to club business.

By completing your registration, you are providing your consent to the Photography & Video Agreement outlined below.

All players are required to acknowledge the following

POLICY STATEMENT

TNC's communication will protect member's privacy, maintain clear boundaries and ensure that bullying and harassment does not occur. TNC is committed to:

- Obtaining permission from the player and/or parent/guardian prior to taking their image.
- Providing information about how images may be used e.g. website/Facebook.
- Only using images of players that are directly relevant to TNC.
- Not publishing offensive posts (content, video or photos).
- The removal of any offensive posts and blocking those responsible from the site.
- No personal information about our members will be disclosed.
- No statements will be made that are misleading, false or likely to injure a member of the clubs reputation.
- Not tolerating any abusive, discriminatory, intimidating or offensive statements.

All social media postings, blogs, status updates and tweets are treated as public 'comments'. If you have any concerns or complaints about inappropriate photographic behaviour please contact the Club immediately. Non-Compliance Members may face disciplinary action for sending inappropriate electronic communication or posting online content or comments that harass, offend, intimidate or humiliate another member.





The seriousness of the offense will be at the discretion of the Committee and the length of the penalty imposed under certain circumstances, cyber bullying (e.g. bullying that is carried out through an internet service such as email, a chat room, discussion group, instant messaging or website) is a criminal offence that can be reported to the police.
